# Scholarship Requirements (con't.)

- **SAT – 1100**
- **ACT – combined English + Math = 44**
  - i.e. 23 English + 21 Math **or** 20 English + 24 Math.

Students not afforded the opportunity to take either SAT or ACT may take the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) and must score a minimum:

**AFQT = 81**

## Pre-Medical

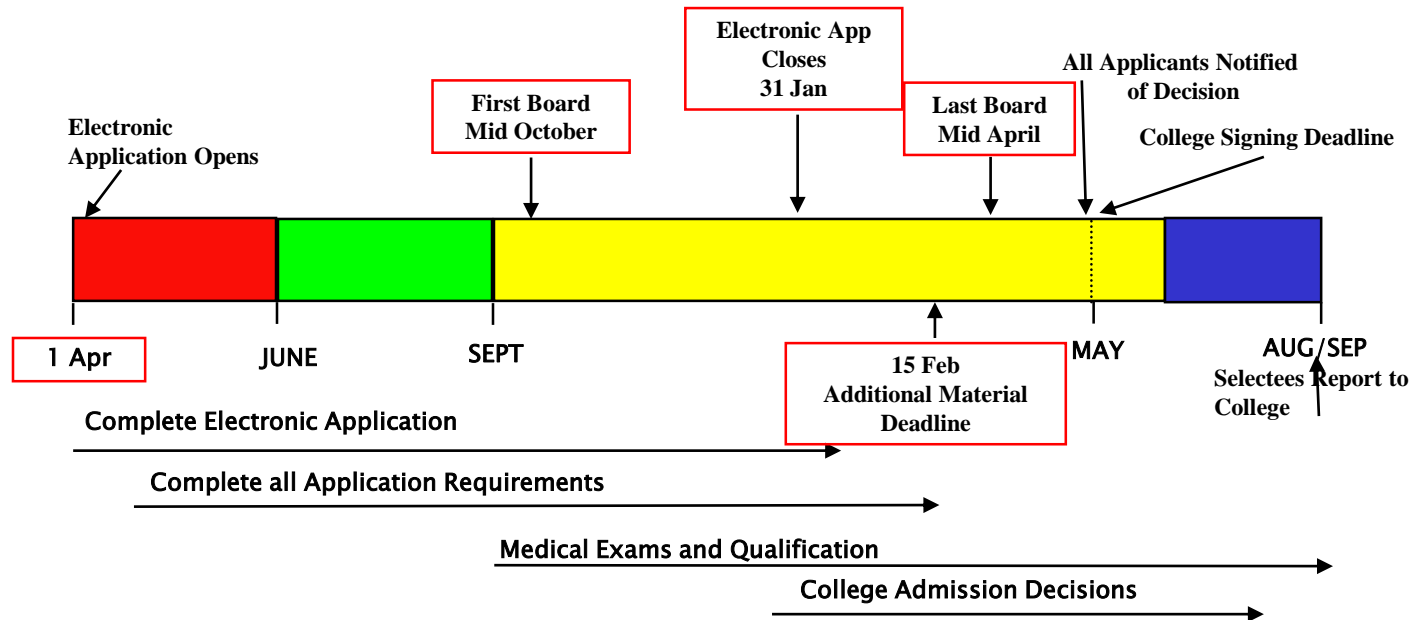
### ■ Requirements for Application:

- SAT = 1300
- ACT = 28
- GPA = 3.5

Upon graduation and passing the MCAT must be accepted to medical school. If not accepted to medical school -> Unrestricted Line.

# Scholarship Benefits

- Full Tuition and Academic Fees

Benefits paid only for the time required to receive a Baccalaureate Degree or 40 months whichever comes first

- Book Stipend (\$375 per semester or \$250 per quarter)

- Uniforms

- Monthly Stipend

- Freshman = \$250
- Sophomore = \$300
- Junior = \$350
- Senior/5<sup>th</sup> Year = \$400

- 3 summer cruises



# Placement

- Units enrollment is capped. Many, but not all, selectees will be placed at their 1st choice school
- Selectees will be sent an email from the Placement Office providing instructions and form needed to request a change of placement
- If they request a change, OD will change placement, if possible

# Medical

- **Once selected, DODMERB notified: physical needed**
  - DODMERB notifies Concorde
  - Concorde contacts applicant and schedules physical
- **DODMERB may PQ or NPQ**
  - If NPQ, BUMED may recommend waiver
    - If CNSTC approves waiver – good to go
    - If CNSTC disapproves waiver – end of the line
- **Once PQ, must notify Unit if medical condition changes**
- **If not PQ by start of semester**
  - Will have to pay tuition up front but may be reimbursed if eventually PQ. Retropayment does not include subsistence.

# MSISR Requirements

- **SAT/ACT minimum scores**
  - Same as National minimums
  - Minimums:
    - Math – 540/21
    - Verbal – 550/22
    - Do NOT have to meet combined Math + English 1150
      - Need to check “yes” on MSISR interest question
      - Recommend everyone check “yes” on application
- **All (college students) must meet SAT/ACT requirements**

# NPP Mission

# NROTC Preparatory Program (NPP)

- **Expand NROTC opportunities to produce a more capable and representative Naval Officer Corps.**
- **Partner with 25 Universities in AY 24-25**
- **1 year University funded program that can include tuition, fees, books, room and board for the preparatory year**
  - Each school provides specific levels of funding based on local factors
- **Students who successfully complete the preparatory year receive a 4 year NROTC scholarship**

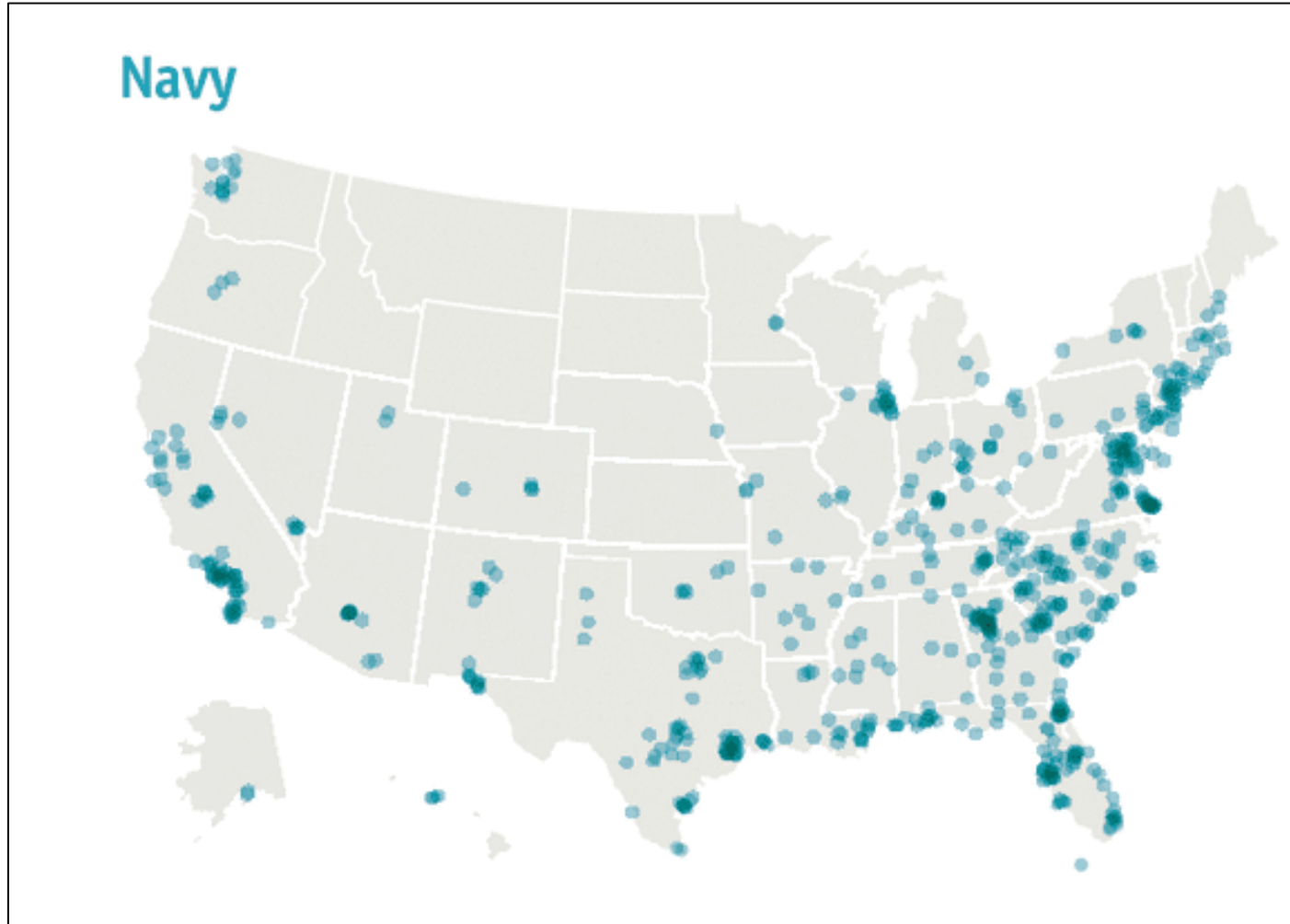

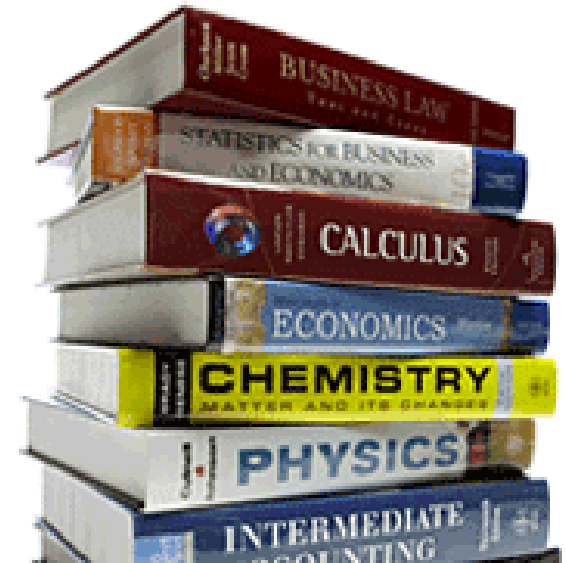






# During the preparatory year, students take a variation of:

- College Algebra
- Pre-Calculus
- Physics
- English
- Communications
- University 101
- Introduction to Military Science
- Tutoring, Guidance, and Mentorship





# NROTC Preparatory Program (NPP)

- **One-year preparatory program, funded by the University**
- **Ideal graduate performance competitive with scholarship MIDN 4/C**
  - Mastery of math through pre-calculus and physics/chemistry
  - Introductory understanding of Calculus
  - Able to exceed PRT minimums
  - Above a 3.3 GPA with a least 24 college credit hours
- **Required performance minimums**
  - 2.8 GPA with 15 credit hours, based on historic USNA NAPS Data
  - Pass the PRT with a good-low
  - Good Standing with the affiliated unit
  - Recommend by University and NROTC Professor of Naval Science (PNS)/CO
- **MIDN Candidates are non-contract MIDN (DOD-I)**
  - Uniforms, basic summer training, PT, participate in NROTC training events



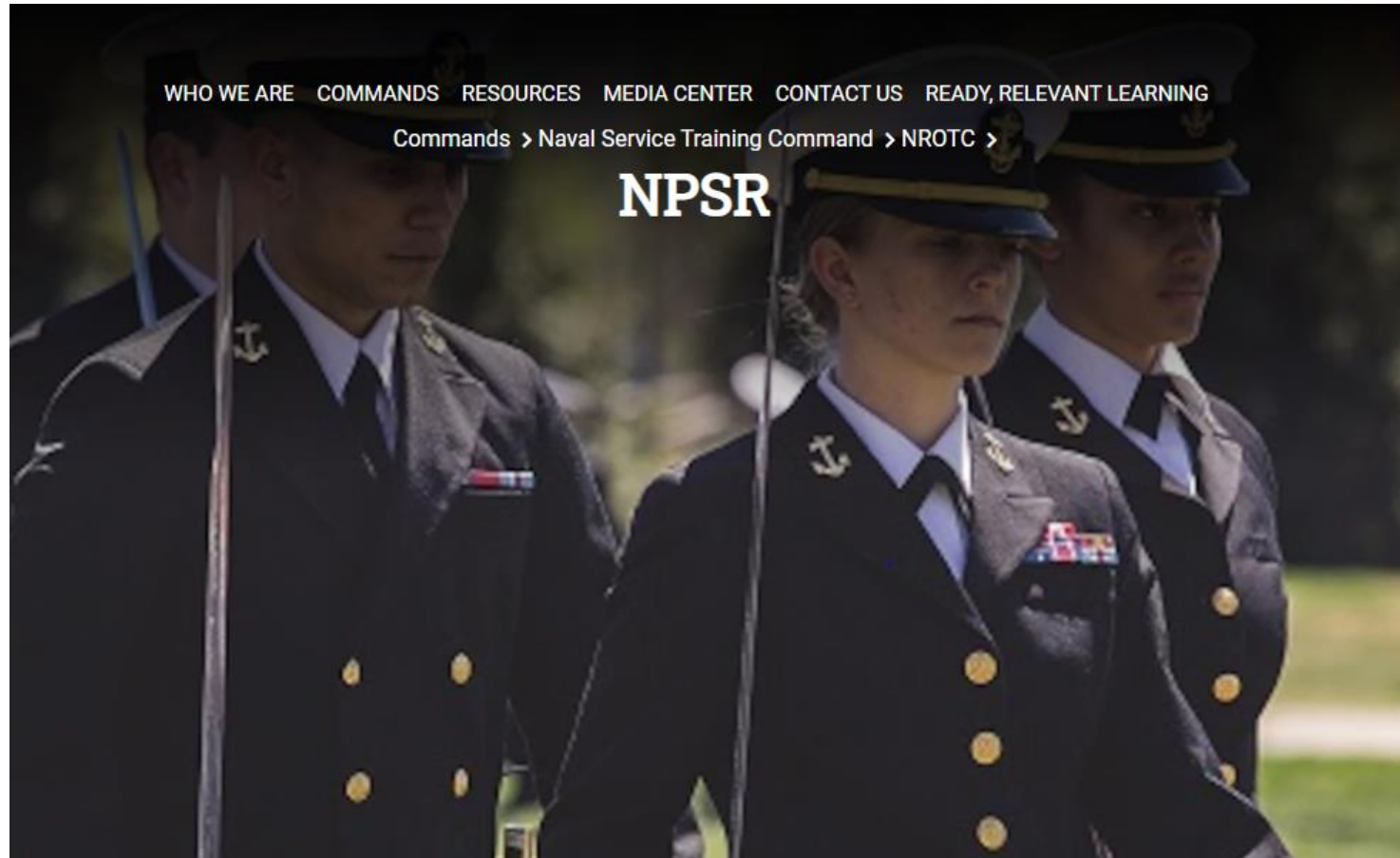

# NPP Results

- Of 551 students who started NPP, 90.2.% complete the preparatory year as of 19MAR24
- Of 411 NPP students who have received NROTC scholarships, 86.8% remain in the program
